External Issues and Concerns:

Stray Cat Population

The shelter euthanized almost 383 cats and 585 kittens last year, many were more akin to wildlife than domestic pets.

Unleashed Dogs

The presence of unleashed dogs, especially in parks and on trails has led to both animal on animal and animal on citizen issues.

Lack of Spay / Neuter Resources

- While there are private sector resources for low cost spay/neuter these resources fall short of being able to impact shelter intake and animal population.
- Citizen's responsibility for cleaning up after their pets
 - Animal Services receives many complaints about citizens not picking up after their pets, this not only includes public places, but neighborhoods as well.

On-site Veterinary Care & On-site Spay/Neuter

Consistently having 100-200 animals in our care necessitates onsite veterinary care
